Ana Pogacnik - September 3

Ana Pogacnik, founder of Schule "Wieder sehen" - "To See Again", is the International Geomancy instructor as well as an accomplished musician and composer. Co-author of the book *How Wide the Heart: The Roots of Peace in Palestine and Israel*.

Nancy Poer - September 24

Nancy Jewel Poer is known across the United States for her lively lectures on Waldorf education, parenting, child development, the spiritual feminine, the role of women in America, and threshold work. An artist and writer, she has authored *A Child's First Book*, and *Living into Dying*. Nancy is a co-founder of Rudolf Steiner College and has taught there for more than 30 years.

Dennis Klocek - October 1

Dennis Klocek, M.F.A., is director of the Consciousness Studies Program at Rudolf Steiner College and author of *A Biodynamic Book of Moons; Drawing from the Book of Nature; Weather and Cosmos; and Seeking Spirit Vision*.

Margrethe Solstad - October 15

Margrethe Solstad is former General Secretary of the Anthroposophical Society in Norway and, until recently, director of the Norwegian Eurythmy School; for the past year, head of the Performing Arts Section (for Eurythmy, Speech, Music, Puppetry and Drama) at the Goetheanum.

MariJo Rogers taught at the Sacramento Waldorf High School and in the weekend Foundation Year at Rudolf Steiner College. She works at Hewlett-Packard Company and serves as co-general secretary of the Anthroposophical Society in the United States.

Jannebeth Röell - November 14 & 15

Jannebeth Röell, B.F.A., RN, worked as an anthroposophical nurse in the Netherlands. After moving to the United States in 1980, she obtained a B.F.A. from Art Center College of Design in Pasadena. She lives in Portland, OR, where she focuses on art therapy.

Sanford Miller - December 17

Sanford Miller is a Christian Community priest in Sacramento, CA.
